

Yiannis Taverna

A Greek taverna in the atmospheric, narrow streets of Koskinou, with eating areas both inside and out. Choose from an extensive menu after first looking round the kitchen to see what they're cooking. Located on the main village street, just south of the church.

Some different dishes include: **spetzofai** (sausage & peppers in spicy sauce)

seftaliá (homemade sausage)

kondosouvli (spiced pork on the souvla or spit)

There is also pork in wine, goat, *kokkinistó*, squid and octopus, etc.

Before going to Yiannis to eat, it's worth having a look at the 'Traditional House of Koskinou' — just a few doors from Yiannis, on the same side of the road (open 10.00-13.00 and 18.00-20.00; weekends; entrance is free).

Profítis Ámos

Don't be put off by the fact that it's in Faliraki; this really is an unexpected haven, far away from the bustle of Faliraki centre. This taverna, a warm-weather-only venue, is on the site of an old monastery complex dedicated to the Prophet Amos. You can sit outside on a terrace tucked into the hillside with an elevated view over the surrounding countryside.

To find it, turn seawards at the staggered junction traffic lights on the southern edge of Faliraki (opposite the road inland to Kalithiés). Fork right immediately, then take the second right (which may have a signpost to Moní Ámos). Stay on this road as it leads towards the hillside and the taverna at the end.

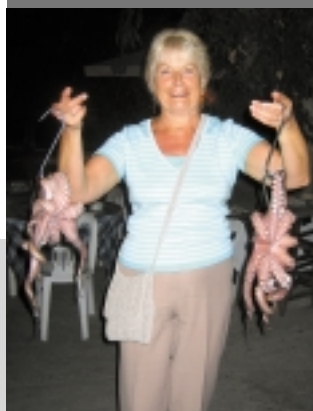
